Needs Statement

Each day, children and families throughout Central Texas wonder where their next meal will come from. In the summers, when children can no longer access free lunches at school, the need for healthy foods is exceptional. With limited resources and little hope, families turn to cheap, fast-food options or simply go without. Many low-income residents in our community live in rural pockets, where access to grocery stores, Austin-based nonprofits, and other support services is incredibly limited. No child in Bastrop should wonder where their next meal will come from, and the Bastrop County Emergency Food Pantry is the largest community food bank exclusively serving Bastrop - ensuring our community's most vulnerable receive the guidance, sustenance, and support they need. NIBBLES Program (Nutrition in Backpacks Before Little's Exit School Program) our newest endeavor. Bastrop County Emergency Food Pantry & Support Center received an urgent cry for help from the teachers and staff at Bastrop Independent School district 308 kids that are food insecure and were at high risk of hunger over the weekend break. These kids need meals to go home with them at the end of the day on Friday to ensure they do not go hungry over the weekend. Bastrop County Emergency Food Pantry and some wonderful partners step up to tackle the problem. As of today 142 of, the 308 kids in need are being fed each week by the BCEFP NIBBLES Program. We are hoping that through our fundraising efforts with Amplify Austin we hope to raise \$5,000.00 to help the other 183 kids.
