BASTROP COUNTY EMERGENCY FOOD PANTRY **NIBBLES** Program

The Nutrition in Backpacks before Little One's Exit School (NIBBLES) provides weekend meals and snacks during the school year for 168 children from low-income families at Lost Pines Elementary, Red Rock Elementary, Emile Elementary, and Bastrop Intermediate schools. The schools provide in-school time food, but families have little to no options for the weekends, until now. The Food Pantry purchases the food and coordinates with local volunteers to put the 5lbs of food bags together and deliver them weekly to the schools every Friday. The students receive enough food and snacks for the entire weekend. The Pantry to continue to serve the 1 in 4 Bastrop County youth who experience food insecurity.

NIBBLES program is three years old and brings joy and security to many sweet little faces at BISD each week.

This school year so far NIBBLES has distributed more than 34,000 pounds of food. Every week a team of volunteers prep and prepare a bag of food that can travel home with a student on the bus.
