Volunteer Phase One—White Paae

SUMMARY

The Food Pantry is beginning phase one of the transition back to pre-pandemic distribution and policies beginning July 1, 2021. During this Phase there are a few important things to note.

- 1. Masks are required when in the building regardless of vaccination status.
- 2. Clients will be allowed into the building and will once again get to choose their food (NO PREPACKING), but there will be a limit to how many people are allowed inside at a time.
- 3. Fresh Food for Families is returning, with the first distribution being held July 16 at 10am
- 4. We will be serving clients every 30-days and will be adding a by appointment day at the end of the summer.

Brown Bag/ Whole Grains/Commodity Boxes/Open Arms

- Clients may elect to do a curbside distribution rather than enter the building.
- Client choice returns (no more prepacking)

- Health screenings

- Spend less than 15 minutes per client to limit exposure
- Only two clients in the building at a time
- Transportation and senior activities will be addressed in phase 2

Emergency Food Assistance

- Client choice returns
- Thursdays will be by appointment only (NO WALK UPS) starting in August/September
- Clients may choose a curbside option for services
- Front door will remain locked and doorbell system kept in place. Clients take a number.
- Waiting Room will have two clusters of four chairs that are as far apart as space allows.
- Limiting Persons in Pantry
 - Two (4 person) families ONLY in waiting room at a time
 - Large families will be encouraged to use curbside or appointment only.
 - Ages three and up MUST wear a mask for the health and safety of the staff and volunteers.
