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CENTRAL TEXAS FOOD BANK SPOTLIGHTS BCEFP

We are so grateful for the support we receive through the Central Texas Food Bank and various grants to help us fulfill our mission to meet the needs of our neighbors in crisis. Last summer BCEFP received a Capacity Building Grant from the Central Texas Food Bank to help expand and improve our ability to serve our neighbors. We were recently featured in their agency spotlight, and I have attached an excerpt from the article:

Food Bank Supports Bastrop County Emergency Food Pantry with Capacity Building Grant

Within the last few years, Central Texas has witnessed a tremendous amount of growth, even amidst a global pandemic and our own natural disasters. As folks continue to make their way to the region, counties struggle to keep up with infrastructure growth. As we have seen, this has led to an increase in need from folks that fall into vulnerable populations in our community. Bastrop County has been no exception. While COVID-19 brought about nearly insurmountable challenges for everyone, Bastrop was still recovering from the 2011 and 2015 fires. The 2011 fires alone destroyed just over 1,700 homes. While the community has worked to rebuild since then, the pandemic and last year's winter storm has continued to drain their resources.

A shining beacon of hope in all of this has been the Bastrop County Emergency Food Pantry, who, since 1987, continues to serve the basic needs of Bastrop County residents. Last summer, they received a Capacity Building Grant from the Central Texas Food Bank to help them expand and improve their ability to serve their neighbors.

GALAXY DIGITAL

All volunteers are required to take the training, but the area you volunteer in will determine which training you are to take. 

IMMEDIATE VOLUNTEER POSITIONS AVAILABLE ARE:

HEB PICK-UP: This involves picking up bread, produce and protein from HEB by 8:30am and dropping it off at our Support Center. We need volunteers for Thursday mornings and rotating every other Saturday morning.

NIBBLES PREP: This involves dating the food items that are to be placed in the Nibbles bags on build day. It takes place on Monday and Friday from 8:30-11:30 or 1:30-3:30 in the NIBBLES building.

NIBBLES BUILD: This involves placing items in bags which will be given to school children to take home, providing them with food to have over the weekend. We need teams of 3 every Wednesday from 8:30-11:30 (eventually to rotate every other week).

FRESH FOOD FOR FAMILIES: This involves setting up tables; sorting, weighing and bagging produce; greeting clients; distributing bags & boxes to clients; assisting clients to their cars when needed; cleaning up and taking down tables. This is a monthly event occurring on the 3rd Friday of each month from 9am-11am. This is an outdoor event that takes place rain or shine.

BUILDING EMERGENCY BOXES / STOCKING: This involves building boxes of food items for emergency clients as needed, as well as stocking and rotating inventory. Volunteers could be lifting 20-50 lbs. It takes place Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:30-11:30am and 1:30-3:30pm in the Emergency Services in the main building.

DONATION CENTER: This involves sorting, dating, packing boxes and moving them to the Emergency Pantry for distribution. This can be done Monday – Friday from 8:30-11:30am or 1:30-3:30pm, or on the 1st Thursday of the month from anytime between 1:30pm-6:30pm (on Pantry Express day).

GROUP VOLUNTEERS: There are many opportunities for church groups, school groups, families, civic clubs, workgroups, etc. to volunteer. The more the merrier!
