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IN HONOR OF HUNGER AWARENESS MONTH, we invite you to join us in the effort to end childhood hunger in our community. This year we have experienced a 34% increase in request for services compared to last year. And nearly half of those we serve are children under 18 years old. While the local schools often provide free or reduced cost lunches and breakfast, students have little to no options for food during the weekend. Childhood hunger and poor nutrition leads to an increase in chronic disease like diabetes; poorer mental health; and behavioral and academic barriers in children including increased dropout rates (Feeding America, 2019).

The county's vulnerable children under 18 experience hunger at an alarming rate with many schools reporting that at least 70% of their students fall below the poverty line. Our NIBBLES (The Nutrition in Backpacks before Little Ones Exit School program) provides weekend meals and snacks during the school year for 272 children from lowincome families at Lost Pines Elementary, Mina Elementary Red Rock Elementary, Emile Elementary, Bluebonnet Elementary, Cedar Creek Intermediate, and Bastrop Intermediate schools. With 1 in 4 Bastrop County children going hungry, we are serving just the tip of the iceberg and we need your help. Please consider volunteering in our NIBBLES program which will resume on Friday, September 9th as the first Prep day of the season. Prep days will be on Fridays and Mondays, and then **Build** days will be on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. This is such a vital program for our school children, and we are excited to see it starting up again. If you want more information about this wonderful program, be sure to check it out in Galaxy Digital where you can read more about it and also sign up to volunteer for either a Prep day or a Build day.



### **VOLUNTEER SHIFTS**

Please make sure you are signing up for your volunteer shifts by placing your name on the schedule in Galaxy Digital. This is how we know who will be volunteering that day. Volunteer shifts are limited to a specific number of volunteers. If you are not on the schedule in Galaxy Digital and show up for a volunteer shift that is already full, we will not be able to find something else for you to do.

We have a lot of new volunteers wanting to sign up for opportunities, so if you have signed up and cannot make it, please remove your name from the schedule as soon as possible so it will be available to another volunteer. If you are not sure you can fulfill your obligation to an opportunity, please do not place yourself on Galaxy Digital schedule.

#### NOTE:

Pantry buildings MUST be vacated and ready to be locked by 11:30am. We appreciate how diligent our volunteers are in wanting to get tasks completed so we are asking that you be sure to be finished by 11:30am. Staff members have a number of duties that need to be attended to before they are able to close the pantry, so we ask that there be no volunteers in our program buildings after 11:30am.

### VOLUNTEER **OPPORTUNITIES**

#### **IMMEDIATE VOLUNTEER POSITIONS AVAILABLE ARE:**

**INVENTORY:** This involves various tasks in our Emergency Center that could consist of: Bagging: Re-bagging items, such as frozen chicken, into smaller bags. re-bagging items such as beans or rice into smaller bags using a sealer machine. Stocking: Restocking inventory items. Light Cleaning: Wiping down refrigerators, tables, scales, other surfaces as needed. Sweeping and mopping. Other inventory tasks as needed. It takes place Monday through Friday from 8:30am-11:30am and 1:30pm-3:30pm. Volunteers will be trained on how to use the sealing machine.

BUILDING EMERGENCY BOXES / STOCKING: This involves building boxes of food items for emergency clients as needed, as well as stocking and rotating inventory. Volunteers could be lifting 20-50 lbs. It takes place Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:30-11:30am and 1:30-3:30pm in the Emergency Services in the main building.

HEB WEEKEND PICK-UP: This involves picking up bread, produce and protein from HEB by 8:30am and dropping it off at our Support Center. Volunteers will use their own vehicle. We need volunteers to rotate Saturday and Sunday mornings.

FRESH FOOD FOR FAMILIES: This involves setting up tables; sorting, weighing and bagging produce; greeting clients; distributing bags & boxes to clients; assisting clients to their cars when needed; cleaning up and taking down tables. This is a monthly event occurring on the 3rd Friday of each month from 9am-11am. This is an outdoor event that takes place rain or shine.

**DONATION CENTER:** This involves sorting, dating, packing boxes and moving them to the Emergency Pantry for distribution. This can be done Monday - Friday from 8:30-11:30am or 1:30-3:30pm, or on the 1st Thursday of the month from anytime between 1:30pm-6:30pm (on Pantry Express day).

NIBBLES PREP: This program operates during the BISD school year and suspends during the summer school break. (It will resume for the 2022/2023 school year on Friday, September 9th.) It involves dating the food items that are to be placed in the Nibbles bags. It takes place on Monday and Friday from 8:30-11:30 or 1:30-3:30 in the NIBBLES building.

NIBBLES BUILD: This program operates during the BISD school year and suspends during the summer school break. (It will resume for the 2022/2023 school year on Friday, September 9th.) It involves placing items in bags which will be given to school children to take home, providing them with food to have over the weekend. We need teams of 3 on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 8:30-11:30 (eventually to rotate every other week).

GROUP VOLUNTEERS: There are many opportunities for church groups, school groups, families, civic clubs, workgroups, etc. to volunteer. The more the merrier!
